

John 11:2~ It was, in fact, the Mary that greased the Lord¹ with perfumed oil, and wiped his feet dry with her hair, whose brother, Lazarus, was sick.

Footnote: Or, Master

- 1· This woman Mary was the same Mary that had greased the Lord with perfumed oil and wiped his feet dry with her hair, and her brother, Lazarus, was sick.

[Question] What was the woman Mary, who was one of Lazarus' sisters, and what had she earlier done toward Jesus?

- 2· A woman with an alabaster case of costly **perfumed oil** approached him, and she began pouring it upon his head as he was reclining at the table. (**Matthew 26:7**)

[Question] What did she later do for Jesus, while he was reclining with them in her home?

- 3· And while he was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he was reclining at the meal, a woman came with an alabaster case of **perfumed oil**, genuine nard, very expensive. Breaking open the alabaster case she began to pour it upon his head. (**Mark 14:3**)

[Question] Where was Jesus and in whose home, when Mary have greased him with perfumed oil?

- 4· **Mary**, therefore, took a pound of **perfumed oil**, genuine nard, very costly, and she **greased the feet** of Jesus, and **wiped his feet dry** with her **hair**. The house became filled with the scent of the **perfumed oil**. (**John 12:3**)

[Question] What then, did Mary do with expensive perfumed oil, so that the house filled with its scent?

- 5· And, taking a position behind at his **feet**, she wept and started to wet his **feet** with her tears and she would wipe them off with the **hair** of her head. Also, she tenderly kissed his **feet** and **greased** them with the **perfumed oil**. (**Luke 7:38**)

[Question] What then, did Mary do, as she wiped his feet on that occasion?
