

**John 11:24~** Martha said to him; I know he will rise in the resurrection on the last day.

- 1· So Martha, expressing her faith in the scriptures said, that she knew that her brother would rise in the resurrection on the Last Day.

[Question] What did Martha then reply that her faith was, answered when did she think that this would take place?

- 2· Your dead ones **will** live. A corpse of mine, they **will rise** up. Awake and cry out joyfully, you residents in the dust! For your dew is as the dew of mallows, and the earth itself **will** let even those impotent in death, drop in birth. (**Isaiah 26:19**)

[Question] How did Isaiah prophetically show, how the dead arise?

- 3· And there **will** be many of those asleep in the ground of dust who **will** wake up, these to indefinitely lasting life and those to reproaches and to indefinitely lasting abhorrence. (**Daniel 12:2**)

[Question] What did Daniel state, about many of those asleep in the ground of the dust, and what they would awake to?

- 4· And come out, those who did good things, to a **resurrection** of life, those who practiced vile things, to a **resurrection** of judgment. (**John 5:29**)

[Question] What will those dead ones awake to, and how will their judgments then differ, and according to what?

- 5· And I have hope toward God, which hope these men themselves also entertain, that there is going to be a **resurrection** of both the righteous and the unrighteous. (**Acts of Apostles 24:15**)

[Question] What hope did Paul entertain, that there would be a resurrection of?

- 6· Women received their dead by **resurrection**, but other men were tortured, because they would not accept release by some ransom, in order, that they might attain a better **resurrection**. (**Hebrews 11:35**)

**[Question]** What did Paul show in Hebrews, that faithful women of old received through resurrection?

- 7· **And I saw the dead, the great and the small, standing before the throne, and scrolls were opened. But another scroll was opened, it is the scroll of life. And the dead were judged out of those things written in the scrolls, according to their deeds. (Revelation 20:12)**

**[Question]** What vision of the judgment is shown in Revelation, and how are the dead then judged, and on what basis?

- 8· **Yehowah is a Killer and a Preserver of life, a Bringer down to Sheol, and He brings up. (1 Samuel 2:6)**

**[Question]** What are some of the roles Yehowah God plays toward men?

- 9· **In that day this song will be sung in the land of Judah; We have a strong city. He sets salvation itself for walls and rampart. (Isaiah 26:1)**

**[Question]** How would the people of Judah, then respond to the resurrection of their dead?

- 10· **And as for you yourself, go toward the end, and you will rest, but you will stand up for your lot at the end of the days. (Daniel 12:13)**

**[Question]** What was Daniel told to look forward to, and what would he do in between?

- 11· **And you will be happy, because they have nothing with which to repay you. For you will be repaid in the resurrection of the righteous ones. (Luke 14:14)**

**[Question]** When will many be repaid for their righteous acts, and fine deeds in behalf of others?

- 12· **For this is the will of my Father, that everyone that beholds the Son, and exercises faith in him, should have everlasting life, and I will resurrect him at the last day. (John 6:40)**

**[Question]** What is it the will of Yehowah God, for men exercising faith in Jesus to attain to, and when will this come about?

- 13· **No man can come to me unless the Father, who sent me,**

draws him, and I **will** resurrect him in the **last** day. (**John 6:44**)

**[Question]** Can anyone become an anointed Christian disciple of Jesus, unless Yehowah God calls him to this?

**[Question]** What will Jesus then do, for these ones on the last day?
