

John 11:25~ **Jesus said to her; I, am the resurrection and the life.¹ He that exercises faith in me, even though he dies, will come to life.**

Footnote: I am the resurrection and the life Greek, *E·go' ei·mi he a·na'sta·sis kai he zo·e'*; Latin, *E'go sum re·sur·rec'ti·o et vi'ta*; J22(Hebrew), *'Ani' hat·techi·yah' weha·chai·yim'*

1· So Jesus said to Martha; I, am the resurrection and the life. He that exercises faith in me, even though he dies, will come to life. So then faith in Jesus Christ, is something that will take his followers through the painful experience of death, and into a new existence.

[Question] What did Jesus tell Martha, that he himself was?

[Question] What did he say, that anyone exercising faith in him would experience?

[Question] What then, will faith take anointed Christians through, and into what that lies beyond death?

2· By means of him was life, and the life was the light of men. (John 1:4)

[Question] What came to mankind through Christ, and what did this life become for men?

3· Jesus said to him; I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father, except through me. (John 14:6)

[Question] What did Jesus say he himself was, leading to where?

4· When the Christ, our life, is made manifest, then you also, will be made manifest with him in glory. (Colossians 3:4)

[Question] Who will also become manifest to others, and when?

5· Yes, the life was made manifest, and we have seen, and are bearing witness and reporting to you, the everlasting life which was with the Father, and was made manifest to us. (1 John 1:2)

[Question] What life did John bear witness to seeing firsthand, and who was this life made manifest in?

6· And the living one, and I became dead, but, look! I am living forever and ever, and I have the keys of death and of

Hades. (Revelation 1:18)

[Question] How did Jesus identify himself in Revelation, and for how long does he live now?

[Question] What keys does Jesus hold, and what will he do with them?

- 7· **Most truly I say to you, he that hears my word, and believes him that sent me, has everlasting **life**, and he does not **come** into judgment, but has passed over, from death to **life**. (John 5:24)**

[Question] What does the one hearing Jesus' words and doing them, have?

[Question] What has such a one passed over from, and to?

- 8· **If an able-bodied man **dies**, can he live again? All the days of my compulsory service I shall wait, until my relief **comes**. (Job 14:14)**

[Question] What question did faithful Job ask, for what clearly was his hope in Yehowah God?

- 9· **And there must go forth a twig out of the stump of Jesse, and out of his roots a sprout **will** be fruitful. (Isaiah 11:1)**

[Question] What would come forth out of the stump of Jesse, David's father, and would it grow?

- 10· **And he began to say to me; Son of man, can these bones **come** to life? To that I **said**; Sovereign Lord Yehowah, you yourself well know. (Ezekiel 37:3)**

[Question] What was the Son Of Man asked by Yehowah God, upon seeing a valley filled with dead men's bones?

- 11· **While he was telling them these things, look! A certain ruler who had approached began to do obeisance to him, saying; By now my daughter must be dead, but **come**, and lay your hand upon her, and she **will come** to **life**. (Matthew 9:18)**

[Question] How did Jarius approach Jesus, for what was he afraid would happen soon, due to his daughter's illness?

- 12· **On hearing this, Jesus answered him; Have no fear, only**

put forth **faith**, and she **will** be saved. (**Luke 8:50**)

[Question] What did Jesus tell faithful Jarius would happen, if he continued in faith?

- 13· For just as the Father raises the dead up, and makes them alive, so the Son also, makes those alive, whom he wants to. (**John 5:21**)

[Question] What power, that Yehowah God has, has he also given to his son?

- 14· But certain ones of both the Epicurean and the Stoic philosophers took to conversing with him controversially, and some would say; What is it, this chatterer would like to tell? Others; He seems to be a publisher of foreign deities. This was, because he was declaring the Good News of Jesus, and the **resurrection**. (**Acts of Apostles 17:18**)

[Question] How did the Greeks feel upon hearing the witness of the apostle Paul, regarding the resurrection of Christ?

- 15· Because he has set a day, in which he purposes to judge the inhabited earth in righteousness, by a man whom he has appointed, and he has furnished a guarantee to all men, in that, he has resurrected him from the dead. (**Acts of Apostles 17:31**)

[Question] What day is fast approaching for mankind, and what guarantees that this day will in fact come, and that men cannot put it off?

- 16· And I have hope toward God, which hope these men themselves also entertain, that there is going to be a **resurrection** of both the righteous and the unrighteous. (**Acts of Apostles 24:15**)

[Question] What hope toward Yehowah God did the apostle Paul entertain for the future of all men?

- 17· For since death, is through a man, **resurrection** of the dead, is also through a man. (**1 Corinthians 15:21**)

[Question] Since death is through a man, what must also come through a man, and who is that man?

- 18· The teaching on baptisms and the laying on of the hands,

the **resurrection** of the dead, and everlasting judgment.
(**Hebrews 6:2**)
