- 1· So after that, Jesus no longer walked about publicly among the Jews, but he left there for the country around the wilderness, into a city called Ephraim, where he remained for a time with his disciples.

[Question] What then, could Jesus no longer do freely among the Jews, and so where did he depart for with his disciples?

- 2· When they persecute you in one **city**, flee to another, for truly I say to you, you will by no means complete the circuit of the cities of Israel until the Son of man arrives. (**Matthew 10:23**)

[Question] What counsel did Jesus give his disciples when preaching, as to what they should do, when they were persecuted in one city?

- 3· But he motioned to them with his hand to be silent and told them in detail, how Yehowah brought him out of the prison, and he said; Report these things to James and the brothers. With that he went out, and journeyed to another place. (**Acts of Apostles 12:17**)

[Question] What did Peter do immediately, when he was released by an angel from prison, and where did he go to flee the Jews and remain safe?

- 4· Now after these things Jesus continued walking **about** in Galilee, for he did not want to walk **about** in Judea, because the **Jews** were seeking to kill him. (**John 7:1**)

[Question] Where did Jesus also choose to walk about, after the Jews came out and tried to kill him?
