

John 11:9~ **Jesus answered; There are twelve hours of daylight, are there not? If anyone walks in daylight, he does not bump against anything, because he sees the light of this world.**

1· So Jesus told them, that there are twelve hours of daylight, and that if anyone walked about during this period of light, that he would not stumble over anything, because he walked by means of the light of this world. This inferred that he still had time before the time came for him to sacrifice himself, which would begin the night of darkness.

[Question] What illustration then, did Jesus give them, and what did this illustration infer, that there was time for, before his own sacrifice?

2· We must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day, the night is coming, when no man can work. (John 9:4)

[Question] Whose works did Jesus tell them, that they must work during the daytime, for what time was indeed coming?

3· When you walk, your pace will not be cramped, and if you run, you will not stumble. (Proverbs 4:12)

[Question] What do the Proverbs state about the path of the righteous ones?

4· He that loves his brother remains in the light, and there is no cause for stumbling in his case. (1 John 2:10)

[Question] What does the one loving his brother remain in, and what will he not do, since he is in the light?
