John 13:15~ For I set the pattern for you, that, just as I did to you, you should do also.

1. So in doing this, Jesus was setting a pattern for them in the future. Just as he had done to them, so this was the way, that they should do to one another.

[Question] How is the life course of Jesus Christ an example for Christians?

[Question] In view of Jesus' example above of washing other's feet, what does this show that we should do for our Christian brothers, as their needs dictate?

2. Therefore all the things they tell you, do and observe, but do not do according to their deeds, for they say but do not perform. (Matthew 23:3)

[Question] Whose example, did Jesus tell his apostles not to follow, and why so?

3. Keep this mental attitude in you, that was also in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 2:5)

[Question] What kind of mental attitude should anointed Christians keep within themselves?

4. In fact, to this course you were called, because even Christ suffered for you, leaving you a model for you to follow his steps closely. (1 Peter 2:21)

[Question] How did the sufferings of Jesus Christ leave a model for anointed Christians to follow after?

5. He that says, he remains in union with him, is under obligation himself, also to go on walking, just as that one walked. (1 John 2:6)

[Question] What does one put oneself under obligation to do, when they say that they are Christians, or followers of Jesus Christ?

6 Because those whom he gave his first recognition, he also foreordained to be patterned after the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers.

(Romans 8:29)

[Question] What does Yehowah God expect his other anointed Christian sons to be patterned after?

7. By this we have come to know love, because that one surrendered his soul for us, and we are under obligation to surrender our souls for our brothers. (1 John 3:16)
