Most truly I say to you, a slave is not greater than his master, nor is one that is sent forth, greater than the one that sent him.

Footnote: One that is sent forth Or, an apostle (envoy) Greek, $a \cdot po'sto \cdot los$; Latin, $a \cdot po'sto \cdot lus$

1. So now he used a common illustration, that a slave is never greater than his master, nor is a messenger, ever greater than the one sending him forth.

[Question] How did Jesus illustrate their relative position to him, and also to Yehowah God?

2. A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a slave above his lord. (Matthew 10:24)

[Question] What is a disciple never above, or a slave never above?

3. A pupil is not above his teacher, but everyone that is perfectly instructed, will be like his teacher. (Luke 6:40)

[Question] What though, will anyone who is perfectly instructed be like?

4. Bear in mind the word I said to you; A slave is not greater than his master. If they have persecuted me, they will persecute you also. If they have observed my word, they will observe yours also. (John 15:20)
