

**John 13:18~** I am not talking about all of you. I know the ones I have chosen. But it is in order, that the Scripture might be fulfilled: He that used to feed on my bread, has lifted up his heel against me.

**1·** So then, he showed that he was not talking about all of them, for the most of them were putting his counsel into practice. Then he showed, that the scripture, regarding one of his disciples, must come to fulfillment, that one of his disciples who was living off of his bread, would betray him, and lift up his heel against him.

**[Question]** Whom then did Jesus show that he was speaking about, for what were most of his disciples doing?

**[Question]** What scripture did Jesus then show must come to fulfillment?

**2·** You did not choose me, but I chose you. I appointed you to go on and keep bearing fruit and that your fruit should remain, in **order**, that no matter what you ask the Father in my name, he **might** give it to you. (**John 15:16**)

**[Question]** Do anointed Christians choose Jesus and Yehowah God, or are they chosen by them, and then presented with the Good News?

**[Question]** What course then are they appointed to fulfill?

**3·** Just as he chose us in union with him before the founding of the world, that we should be holy, and without blemish before him, in love. (**Ephesians 1:4**)

**[Question]** Who chose anointed Christians and when?

**[Question]** What does Yehowah God want all his anointed Christian sons to become before him, and like him?

**4·** However, we are obligated to thank God always for you, brothers loved by Yehowah, because God selected you from the beginning for salvation, by sanctifying you with spirit, and by your faith in the truth. (**2 Thessalonians 2:13**)

**[Question]** Who selected all of the anointed Christian sons of God, and for what?

**[Question]** How does Yehowah God then sanctify these ones?

**5·** On this account, I go on enduring all things for the sake of the **chosen ones**, that they too, may obtain the salvation

that is in union with Christ Jesus, along with everlasting glory. (2 Timothy 2:10)

**[Question]** What did Paul keep on enduring sufferings for, and to what end for his Christian brothers?

- 6· When I was with them, I **used** to watch over them on account of your own name, which you **have** given me, and I **have** kept them, and not one of them is destroyed, except the son of destruction, in **order**, that the scripture **might** be **fulfilled**. (John 17:12)

**[Question]** How did Jesus show his disciples how he had watched over his brothers while among them?

- 7· Also the man at peace with me, in whom I trusted, who was eating my **bread**, **has** magnified his **heel** against me. (Psalms 41:9)

**[Question]** How did the Psalms show in prophecy, how a close associate of Jesus would betray him?

- 8· In reply he said; He that dips his hand with me in the bowl, is the one that will betray me. (Matthew 26:23)

**[Question]** How did Jesus identify his betrayer on the night before he died?

- 9· Further, when he offered the sacrifices, Absalom sent for Ahithophel the Gilonite, David's counselor, from his city Giloh. And the conspiracy kept getting stronger, and the people were continually growing in number with Absalom. (2 Samuel 15:12)

**[Question]** How did David experience a similar disloyal one coming from within his own family and close associates?

- 10· And to David the report was made, saying; Ahithophel himself is among those conspiring with Absalom. At this David said; Turn, please, the counsel of Ahithophel into foolishness, O Yehowah! (2 Samuel 15:31)

**[Question]** Who also among David's close associates went along with David's son Absalom?

- 11· For it was not an enemy that proceeded to reproach me, otherwise I could put up with it. It was not an intense

hater of me that assumed great airs **against** me. Otherwise I could conceal myself from him. (**Psalms 55:12**)

**[Question]** How did the Psalmist show how a close associate would betray the Christ?

- 12· For a son is despising a father, a daughter is rising up **against** her mother, a daughter-in-law **against** her mother-in-law. A man's enemies are the men of his household. (**Micah 7:6**)

**[Question]** What close relatives did Jesus show would become enemies within this own households?

- 13· Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, who later betrayed him. (**Matthew 10:4**)

**[Question]** Who betrayed Jesus Christ?

- 14· And he went off and talked with the chief priests and temple captains, **about** the effective way to betray him to them. (**Luke 22:4**)

**[Question]** Where did Judas Iscariot go of his own free will, and what did he seek to do, though not pressured to do so by anyone else?

- 15· Jesus answered them; I chose you twelve, did I not? Yet one of you is a slanderer. (**John 6:70**)

**[Question]** What did Jesus say one of his disciples was?

- 16· Men, brothers, it was necessary for the scripture to be **fulfilled**, which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand by David's mouth **about** Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus. (**Acts of Apostles 1:16**)

**[Question]** How did Peter show how the Bible was fulfilled in the actions of Judas Iscariot toward Jesus Christ?
