John 14:31~ But, in order for the world to know that I love the Father, even as the Father has given me commandment to do, so I am doing. Get up, let us go from here.

1. So with these words Jesus concluded his discussion with his disciples, by saying, that he had said these things, in order for the world to know, that he loved the Father. Jesus had then accomplished all the things that his Father had sent him to accomplish. So on leaving he said; Get up, let us go from here. However they did not then immediately leave, but prepared to leave.

[Question] Why had Jesus thus spoken all these words to his disciples on this final night with them?

[Question] What had Jesus accomplished right up to this point?

[Question] Did the disciples actually leave at this moment, or what did they do?

2. No man has taken it away from me, but I surrender it of my own initiative. I have authority to surrender it, and I have authority to receive it again. The commandment on this, I received from my Father. (John 10:18)

[Question] Why could Jesus state, that no man had taken his life away from him?

[Question] What authority did Jesus have when on earth to do with his life, and what authority did he have to regain it, and who gave him this authority?

3. Because I have not spoken out of my own impulse, but the Father himself who sent me, has given me a commandment, as to what to tell, and what to speak. (John 12:49)

[Question] Did Jesus ever speak out of his own impulse, for who told him what to speak?

4. If you observe my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have observed the commandments of the Father, and remain in his love. (John 15:10)

[Question] What is necessary for anointed Christians to remain in Christ's love, and how did Jesus himself set the example for this?

5. More than that, when he found himself in fashion as a man,

he humbled himself, and became obedient as far as death, yes, death on a torture stake. (Philippians 2:8)

[Question] How did Jesus comply with his father's will, when finding himself upon the earth as a man, and how far did his obedience take him?

6. For this is what the love of God means, that we observe his commandments, and yet his commandments are not burdensome. (1 John 5:3)

[Question] What does the love of Yehowah God mean, and is this difficult or burdensome to men?

7. Get up, let us go. Look! My betrayer has drawn near. (Mark 14:42)

[Question] What did Jesus say upon seeing Judas Iscariot approaching with a crowd of men to betray him?
