John 15:11~ These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and your joy may be made full.

1. Jesus then told them, that he spoke these things to them, so that his joy might be within them, and that it might be made full within them.

[Question] Why did Jesus thus speak to his disciples?

2' Until this present time, you have not asked a single thing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be made full. (John 16:24)

[Question] What did Jesus counsel his disciples to ask Yehowah God for, and what would they experience, upon receiving their requests?

3. But now I am coming to you, and I am speaking these things in the world, in order, that they may have my joy in themselves to the full. (John 17:13)

[Question] Why did Jesus speak these things to his disciples?

4. And so we are writing these things, that our joy may be in full measure. (1 John 1:4)

**[Ouestion]** Why did John write his letters of fine counsel?

5. As we look intently at the Chief Agent and Perfecter of our faith, Jesus. For the joy that was set before him, he endured a torture stake, despising shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. (Hebrews 12:2)

[Question] Who sets a fine example of suffering to achieve a grand blessing?
