John 15:24~ If I had not done among them the works that no one else did, they would have no sin. But now they have both seen and hated me, as well as my Father.

1. Jesus then showed, that if he had not come and done the powerful works before them, that they would have no sin, but now that they had seen them, and they still were unrepentant, they had no excuse for their sin. Their rejection of Jesus showed, that they hated Christ, and his heavenly Father.

[Question] Under what circumstances, would the Jews have had no sin?

[Question] Yet now that he had done these fine works among them, and they remained unrepentant, what did they not now have?

[Question] What did their rejection of Jesus Christ, show that they also hated?

2. And you, Capernaum, will you perhaps be exalted to heaven? Down to Hades you will come. Because if the powerful works that took place in you, had taken place in Sodom, it would have remained until this very day. (Matthew 11:23)

[Question] What did Jesus say would be the end for cities that heard his teaching, and saw his powerful works, but did not repent?

3. Still, many of the crowd put faith in him, and they commenced saying; When the Christ arrives, he will not perform more signs than this man has performed, will he? (John 7:31)

[Question] What did many of the common people among the Jews feel, upon seeing Jesus' powerful works?

4. Consequently the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered the Sanhedrin together and began to say; What are we to do, because this man performs many signs? (John 11:47)

[Question] What did even Jesus' opposers feel, when seeing his many signs?

5. Jesus said to them; If you were blind, you would have no sin. But now you say; We see. Your sin remains. (John 9:41)

[Question] Why did Jesus state, that the sin of the Pharisees remained, for what did they claim to know about sin, while remaining unrepentant?

6' You must not bow down to them, nor be induced to serve them, because I, Yehowah your God, am a God exacting exclusive devotion, bringing punishment for the error of fathers upon sons, upon the third generation and upon the fourth generation, in the case of those who hate me. (Exodus 20:5)

[Question] What kind of a God is Yehowah God, and what does he demand of all true worshipers of him?

7. But I well know, that you do not have the love of God in you. (John 5:42)

[Question] What did Jesus tell his audience about themselves?

8. The kings of earth take their stand, and high officials themselves have massed together as one, against Yehowah, and against his anointed one. (Psalms 2:2)

[Question] What did the Psalms show, that the kings of the earth and high officials would do against Yehowah God, and his anointed one?

9. And from before him, I crushed his adversaries to pieces, and to those intensely hating him, I kept dealing out blows. (Psalms 89:23)

[Question] What does Yehowah God deal out, to those hating him?
