

John 15:8~ My Father is glorified in this, that you keep bearing much fruit, and prove yourselves my disciples.

1· Then Jesus told his disciples, that his Father was glorified, in that they keep bearing fruit, and thus prove themselves to be his disciples. For Yehowah God had selected each of them for future heavenly glory, and their bearing of fruit, proves his wisdom in their individual selection.

[Question] What does this bearing of fine fruitage do toward Yehowah God?

[Question] Since Yehowah God selected each one of his spirit anointed Christian sons, what does their measuring up to his standards show about his choosing of them?

3· Thus in the same way that a cultivator proves his wisdom, by gaining very high yields from his vineyard, so their fruitfulness would glorify their maker, Yehowah God the great cultivator of mankind.

[Question] What also shows the wisdom and skill of a vineyard cultivator?

3· Likewise let your light shine before men, that they may see your fine works and give glory to your Father who is in the heavens. (Matthew 5:16)

[Question] What should anointed Christians let shine everywhere, and why?

4· By this, all will know, that you are my disciples, if you have love among yourselves. (John 13:35)

[Question] How would people come to know, that true Christians are truly Jesus' disciples?

5· And may be filled with righteous fruit, which is through Jesus Christ, to God's glory and praise. (Philippians 1:11)

[Question] What did the apostle Paul pray for Christ's disciples to be filled with?

6· To assign to those mourning over Zion, to give them a headdress instead of ashes, the oil of exultation instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of the downhearted spirit. They must be called big trees of righteousness, the

planting of Yehowah, for him to be beautified. (Isaiah 61:3)

[Question] What did Isaiah show, that Yehowah God wants his people to become in the earth, and how does this reflect upon Yehowah God?

7· They said to him; Because nobody has hired us. He said to them; You too, go into the vineyard. (Matthew 20:7)

[Question] Why were some men in Jesus' illustration idle late in the day, and what did this show about some being chosen as spirit anointed Christian sons of God, at a late hour?
