

John 16:22~ You also, therefore, are now, indeed, having grief, but I shall see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and your joy, no one will take from you.

1· Thus his disciples were about to experience great grief over his unlawful death, yet when he was resurrected, they would quickly forget this earlier pain of heart. Then the joy that they would feel, no man would ever be able to take away from them.

[Question] What then, were Jesus' disciples about to experience, yet how would they come to feel after his resurrection?

2· And they did obeisance to him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. (Luke 24:52)

[Question] What did the disciples do, after seeing Jesus, and how did they come to feel?

3· Though you never saw him, you love him. Though you are not looking upon him at present, yet you exercise faith in him, and are greatly rejoicing with an unspeakable and glorified joy. (1 Peter 1:8)

[Question] How did many other Christians coming into the truth, later come to feel also?

4· This is the day that Yehowah has made, we will be joyful and rejoice in it. (Psalms 118:24)

[Question] How did the Psalmist prophesy about this coming day of salvation?

5· Who will not get a hundredfold now in this period of time, houses and brothers and sisters and mothers, and children and fields, with persecutions, and in the coming system of things everlasting life. (Mark 10:30)

[Question] What did Jesus tell his faithful disciples, that they would receive now, and later?

6· But because I have spoken these things to you, grief has filled your hearts. (John 16:6)

[Question] What though, filled his disciples hearts, when he spoke of going away from them?

7. **And after he said this he showed them both his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced at seeing the Lord. (John 20:20)**

[Question] What did Jesus show to eleven of his disciples, and how did they feel, upon seeing he was alive?
