- Jesus spoke these things, and, raising his eyes to heaven, he said; Father, the hour has come. Glorify your son, that your son may glorify you.
 - 1. So after Jesus had spoken these things he raised his eyes heavenward and said; Father, the hour has come. Glorify your son, that your son may glorify you. Jesus' death would honor his heavenly Father more than any other act ever performed by another human being in the history of the world.
 - [Question] What then, did Jesus ask of his Father to do for him, and why was he worthy of glorification by Yehowah God?
 - 2. Next he commanded the crowds to recline on the grass and took the five loaves and two fishes, and, looking up to heaven, he said a blessing and, after breaking the loaves, he distributed them to the disciples, the disciples, in turn, to the crowds. (Matthew 14:19)
 - [Question] Who did Jesus Christ look to, when providing a meal for thousands of men in a remote area?
 - 3. And with a look up into heaven he sighed deeply and said to him; Ephphatha, that is; Be opened. (Mark 7:34)
 - [Question] Who did Jesus look up to when healing a deaf man with a speech impediment?
 - 4 Therefore they took the stone away. Now Jesus raised his eyes heavenward and said; Father, I thank you that you have heard me. (John 11:41)
 - [Question] What did Jesus say upon resurrecting Lazarus, and who did he look to?
 - 5. But Jesus answered them, saying; The hour has come for the Son of man to be glorified. (John 12:23)
 - [Question] What hour did Jesus say had now approached, and how would his glorification proceed?
 - 6. And God will himself glorify him, and he will glorify him immediately. (John 13:32)
 - [Question] Who did Jesus state would glorify Jesus, and can three days later be considered immediately?

7. Father, glorify your name. Therefore a voice came out of heaven, I both glorified it and will glorify it again. (John 12:28)

[Question] What did Yehowah God reply to Jesus' request for his to glorify his own name, Yehowah?

8. Now, because he knew before the festival of the Passover, that his hour had come for him to move out of this world to the Father, Jesus, having loved his own that were in the world, loved them to the end. (John 13:1)

[Question] What time did Jesus realize would come for him at the Passover of 33 C.E?

9. And as it is reserved for men to die once for all time, but after this a judgment. (Hebrews 9:27)

[Question] What is it reserved for all men to experience once, and then what will follow for them?
