

John 17:12~ When I was with them I used to watch over them on account of your own name, which you have given me, and I have kept them, and not one of them is destroyed, except the son of destruction, in order, that the scripture might be fulfilled.

1· Jesus then showed, that when he was with them in person, he used to watch over them, so that they might also glorify his Father's name through their actions and beliefs. Because of his fine shepherding of them, they were all in Yehowah God's protective sheepfold, with the exception of the son of destruction, whose loss was unavoidable, for the prophecies about him must come to fulfillment.

[Question] Why did Jesus watch over his flock of disciples while he was among them, for what did he want to glorify?

[Question] What had resulted from his fine shepherding?

[Question] What one alone had been lost, and why was this necessary?

2· This is the will of him that sent me, that I should lose nothing out of all that he has given me, but that I should resurrect it at the last day. (John 6:39)

[Question] What is the will of Yehowah God respecting all the things Yehowah God has given to his son, Jesus Christ?

3· And I give them everlasting life, and they will by no means ever be destroyed, and no one will snatch them out of my hand. (John 10:28)

[Question] What does Jesus Christ give to his disciples, and can anyone take that away from them?

4· We know that every person that has been born from God, does not practice sin, but the One born from God watches him, and the wicked one does not fasten his hold on him. (1 John 5:18)

[Question] What does every person who is born from God, not practice?

[Question] Who watches over these ones, and who cannot fasten a hold upon them, because of this?

5· In order, that the word might be fulfilled, which he said;

Of those whom you **have given** me, I **have** not lost a single one. (**John 18:9**)

[Question] What did Jesus testify, that he had accomplished later that night?

- 6· True, the Son of man is going away, just as it is written concerning him, but woe to that man through whom the Son of man is betrayed! It would **have** been finer for that man, if he had not been born. (**Mark 14:21**)

[Question] What course must Jesus Christ fulfill, but what would happen to the man who betrayed Jesus Christ?

- 7· But there is a certain fearful expectation of judgment, and there is a fiery jealousy that is going to consume those in opposition. (**Hebrews 10:27**)

[Question] What awaits those who practice sin openly, after receiving the accurate knowledge of God through the Holy Spirit of anointing?

- 8· Also the man at peace with me, in whom I trusted, who was eating my bread, has magnified his heel against me. (**Psalms 41:9**)

[Question] What did the Psalms prophesy about the man betraying Jesus?

- 9· Let his days prove to be few. His office of oversight let someone else take. (**Psalms 109:8**)

[Question] What did another Psalm prophecy about his length of days, and the office of apostle, he once held?

- 10· For it is written in the book of Psalms: Let his lodging place become desolate, and let there be no dweller in it. And: His office of oversight let someone else take. (**Acts of Apostles 1:20**)

[Question] How did Peter later apply this Psalm to Judas Iscariot?

- 11· True, the Son of man is going away, just as it is written concerning him, but woe to that man through whom the Son of man is betrayed! It would **have** been finer for him, if that man had not been born. (**Matthew 26:24**)

[Question] What betrayal had to occur according to scripture?

[Question] Yet how would the man be treated, who betrayed Jesus?

12· I am not talking about all of you. I know the ones I have chosen. But it is in order, that the Scripture might be fulfilled: He that used to feed on my bread has lifted up his heel against me. (John 13:18)

[Question] What did Jesus confess to his disciples before his death, and what scripture did he show applied to Judas Iscariot?
