

**John 18:11~** Jesus, however, said to Peter; **Put the sword into its sheath. The cup that the Father has given me, should I not by all means drink it?**

1· However Jesus calmed Peter down, and told him to return his sword to its sheath. Then he said that the cup, or course, to which he had been called by the Father, should he not by all means drink it? This showed, that to Jesus, the doing of his heavenly Father's will was paramount to him.

[Question] How did Jesus respond though, to calm Peter down?

[Question] Whose will was Jesus fully prepared to accomplish?

[Question] What did Jesus' comment here, show was the foremost thing in his mind then?

2· Then Jesus **said** to him; Return your **sword** to its place, for all those who take the **sword**, will perish by the **sword**. (**Matthew 26:52**)

[Question] What then, did Jesus say to Peter, about all those who take up the sword?

3· But in reply Jesus **said**; Let it go as far as this. And he touched the ear and healed him. (**Luke 22:51**)

[Question] What though, did Jesus put a quick stop to, and what did Jesus immediately do for Malchus, who had been injured?

4· Jesus answered; My kingdom is no part of this world. If my kingdom were part of this world, my attendants would have fought, that I should not be delivered up to the Jews. But, as it is, my kingdom is not from this source. (**John 18:36**)

[Question] What did Jesus later testify to, when before Pilate, that his Kingdom was no part of, else what would his disciples have done to protect him?

5· Jesus **said** in answer; You men do not know what you are asking for. Can you **drink** the **cup**, that I am about to drink? They **said** to him; We can. (**Matthew 20:22**)

[Question] What course did Jesus ask his disciples, if they felt they could follow after him in, and would this course be easy?

- 6· **Again, for the second time, he went off and prayed, saying; My **Father**, if it is not possible for this to pass away, except I **drink** it, let your will take place. (**Matthew 26:42**)**

**[Question]** What did Jesus not look forward to undergoing, yet nonetheless, what was he fully prepared to do?

- 7· **And going a little way forward, he fell upon his face, praying and saying; My **Father**, if it is possible, let this **cup** pass away from me. Yet, not as I will, but as you will. (**Matthew 26:39**)**

**[Question]** What did Jesus ask repeatedly from his Father, that night in prayer, yet whose will did he want to govern over matters that night?

- 8· **But Jesus **said** to them; You do not know what you are asking for. Are you able to **drink** the **cup** which I am drinking, or to be baptized with the baptism, with which I am being baptized? (**Mark 10:38**)**

**[Question]** How did Jesus show James and John, that to follow after his course would be difficult?
