

**John 18:22~** After he said these things, one of the officers that was standing by, gave Jesus a slap in the face and said; Is that the way you answer the chief priest?

1· Then one of the officers of the High Priest who was standing by, gave Jesus a slap on the face, saying; Is that the way you answer the High Priest? All this was designed to provoke Jesus into some action, whereby they could accuse him of wrongdoing.

**[Question]** What did one of the officers of the High Priest then say, and do?

2· My back I **gave** to the strikers, and my cheeks to those plucking off the hair. My **face**, I did not conceal from humiliating **things**, and spit. (**Isaiah 50:6**)

**[Question]** How did Isaiah prophesy, about how the Messiah would be treated by his own people?

3· However, I say to you, do not resist him that is wicked. But whoever **slaps** you on your right cheek, turn the other also to him (**Matthew 5:39**)

**[Question]** What did Jesus tell his disciples to do in reaction to provocation?

4· And they began coming up to him and saying; Good day, you King of the Jews! Also, they would give him **slaps** in the **face**. (**John 19:3**)

**[Question]** How did the Jewish religious leaders actually treat Jesus, when under arrest and bound?

5· At this the High Priest Ananias, ordered those **standing** by him, to strike him on the mouth. (**Acts of Apostles 23:2**)

**[Question]** What did the Jewish High Priest order the guards to do to Jesus while bound?

6· At this time you make cuttings upon yourself, O daughter of an invasion, a siege he has laid against us. With the rod they will strike upon the cheek, the judge of Israel. (**Micah 5:1**)

**[Question]** What did the prophecy of Micah show they would do to the judge of Israel?
