

John 18:28~ Then they led Jesus from Caiaphas to the governor's palace. It was now early in the day. But they themselves did not enter into the governor's palace, that they might not get defiled, but might eat the Passover.

1· Then they led Jesus from Caiaphas' house, to the governor's palace, to there, accuse him before the governor. It was now just getting light at the start of the day. However they themselves did not enter into the governor's palace, because they did not want to defile themselves, so that they could eat the Passover.

[Question] Where did they later lead Jesus to, after leaving the High Priest's house, and what time of day was it then?

[Question] Why did those religious leaders not want to enter the governor's house themselves?

2· And, after binding him, they led him off and handed him over to Pilate the governor. (**Matthew 27:2**)

[Question] Where then, did the Jews lead Jesus, and who did they hand him over to?

3· And immediately, at dawn, the chief priests with the older men and the scribes, even the whole Sanhedrin, conducted a consultation, and they bound Jesus, and led him off, and handed him over to Pilate. (**Mark 15:1**)

[Question] What did the Sanhedrin then assemble to do, and where was Jesus then led, after this consultation together?

4· So the multitude of them rose, one and all, and led him to Pilate. (**Luke 23:1**)

[Question] Where then did the multitude of the assembled Jews lead Jesus, and why did they take him to Pilate for judgment?

5· The God of Abraham, and of Isaac and of Jacob, the God of our forefathers, has glorified his Servant, Jesus, whom you, for your part, delivered up and disowned before Pilate's face, when he had decided to release him. (**Acts of Apostles 3:13**)

[Question] How did Peter later lay the blame upon those religious leaders of the Jews, for Jesus' death?

- 6· **And he said to them; You well know how unlawful it is for a Jew to join himself to, or approach, a man of another race, and yet God has shown me, I should call no man defiled or unclean. (Acts of Apostles 10:28)**

[Question] What did Peter himself later testify, about how the Jews felt about going into the home of a foreigner, a man of the nations?

- 7· **Among the apostate mockers for a cake, there was a grinding of their teeth even against me. (Psalms 35:16)**

[Question] How did the Psalmist show, how Jesus would be treated by these idol worshipping men?

- 8· **Day and night they go round about it upon its walls, and hurtfulness and trouble are within it. (Psalms 55:10)**

[Question] How did the Psalmist prophesy, about how the men of Jerusalem would act?

- 9· **If he does not listen to them, speak to the congregation. If he does not listen even to the congregation, let him be to you, just as a man of the nations, and as a tax collector. (Matthew 18:17)**

[Question] How do anointed Christian disciples respond, to any man who refuses fine counsel repeatedly?

- 10· **When it had become morning, all the chief priests and the older men of the people, held a consultation against Jesus, so as to put him to death. (Matthew 27:1)**

[Question] What did the older men of the Jews then do towards Jesus very early that morning, before most people even were up and around?

- 11· **So Pilate put the question to him; Are you the king of the Jews? In answer to him, he said; You yourself say it. (Mark 15:2)**

[Question] What question did Pilate ask of Jesus, and how did Jesus answer him?
