John 19:1~ At that time, therefore, Pilate took Jesus and scourged him.

1. So at that time Pilate took Jesus and had him scourged, for the Jews by their choice, had condemned him to death.

2' My back I gave to the strikers, and my cheeks to those plucking off the hair. My face I did not conceal from humiliating things, and from spit. (Isaiah 50:6)

3. And will deliver him up to men of the nations to make fun of and to scourge and to impale, and the third day he will be raised up. (Matthew 20:19)

[Question] Where did Jesus show before it happened, that he would be delivered up to, and how would he be treated?

4. Then he released Barabbas to them, but he had Jesus whipped, and handed him over to be impaled. (Matthew 27:26)

[Question] What did Pilate then do, in accord with the crowd's wishes?

5. At that Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas to them, and, after having Jesus whipped, he handed him over to be impaled. (Mark 15:15)

[Question] Who was Pilate more concerned with, the crowds pleasure, or true justice, and so what did he have done to Jesus before impaling him?

6. And after scourging him, they will kill him, but on the third day, he will rise. (Luke 18:33)

[Question] What had Jesus earlier told his disciples, that the men of the nations would do to him to kill him?

7' He was hard pressed, and he was letting himself be afflicted, yet he would not open his mouth. He was being brought, just like a sheep to the slaughtering, and like a

ewe, that before her shearers has become mute, he also, would not open his mouth. (Isaiah 53:7)

[Question] How did Isaiah prophesy, about how the Messiah would react when before his opposers, and how did he illustrate this?

8. I will therefore chastise him, and release him. (Luke 23:16)
