1. So they took the body of Jesus, and they bound it up with bandages with the spices they brought, just the way the Jews have had the custom of preparing a body for burial.

[Question] What did they now do with Jesus' body, according to Jewish custom?

2. Also the cloth that had been upon his head not lying with the bandages, but separately rolled up in one place. (John 20:7)

[Question] Where did they see the bandages Jesus had been wrapped with lying, after his resurrection?

3. So they buried him in his grand burial place that he had excavated for himself in the City of David, and they laid him in the bed that had been filled with balsam oil, and different sorts of ointment, mixed in an ointment of special make. Further, they made an extraordinarily great funeral burning for him. (2 Chronicles 16:14)

4. And Joseph took the body, wrapped it up in clean fine linen. (Matthew 27:59)

[Question] Who collected Jesus' body for burial, and how did he deal with it?

5. Accordingly he bought fine linen and took him down, wrapped him in the fine linen and laid him in a tomb which was quarried out of a rock-mass, and he rolled a stone up to the door of the memorial tomb. (Mark 15:46)

6 Therefore Jesus said; Let her alone, that she may keep this observance, in view of the day of my burial. (John 12:7)

8. But the younger men rose, wrapped him in cloths, and carried him out and buried him. (Acts of Apostles 5:6)
