John 20:20~ And after he said this he showed them both his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced at seeing the Lord.

1. Then after this he showed them both his hands and his feet, where he had been nailed to the torture stake, also his side where he had been stabbed with the spear by the soldier, after his death. Then the disciples rejoiced, at again seeing their Lord.

[Question] On this second occurrence, what did he again show to all his apostles, to prove that it was indeed him?

2. Yet one of the soldiers jabbed his side with a spear, and immediately, blood and water came out. (John 19:34)

[Question] How had Jesus come to have a spear wound in his side?

3. That, which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have viewed attentively, and our hands felt, concerning the word of life. (1 John 1:1)

[Question] How did John himself bear witness, that he had seen and touched Jesus' wounds after his resurrection?

4 You also, therefore, are now, indeed, having grief, but I shall see you again and your hearts will rejoice, and your joy no one will take from you. (John 16:22)

[Question] What did Jesus tell his apostles, that they would experience over his death, but what would they experience after this, that would never end?

5. Most truly I say to you, you will weep and wail, but the world will rejoice, you will be grieved, but your grief will be turned into joy. (John 16:20)

[Question] What did Jesus tell his disciples, that they would experience, and yet what would their grief be turned into, upon seeing him alive again?
