John 20:27~ Next he said to Thomas; Put your finger here, and see my hands, and take your hand and stick it into my side, and stop being unbelieving, but become believing.

1. So he addressed himself to Thomas and told him to actually touch the wounds, and to view his hands, and stick his finger in his side where the spear had pierced him. He had done this, so that his apostles would all be believing, knowing the certainty of his resurrection. He did not want them to be divided in any way, on this very important point.

[Question] What did Jesus then tell Thomas to do, and to see for himself, for what did Jesus want all his apostles to be sure about?

2. That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have viewed attentively and our hands felt, concerning the word of life. (1 John 1:1)

[Question] How did John bear witness when writing his account, that he and others had touched Jesus, and seen his wounds after his resurrection?

3. And I will pour out upon the house of David and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem the spirit of favor and entreaties, and they will certainly look to the One whom they pierced through, and they will certainly wail over Him, as in the wailing over an only son, and there will be a bitter lamentation over him as when there is bitter lamentation over the firstborn son. (Zechariah 12:10)

[Question] How had Zechariah prophesied, that Israel would come to feel, over the one that they pierced?

4 Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector, James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus. (Matthew 10:3)

[Question] Who were six of Jesus' apostles?

5. So he said to them; O senseless ones, and slow in heart, to believe on all the things the prophets spoke! (Luke 24:25)

[Question] How did Jesus speak to two of his disciples, who were slow to understand the things he spoke about?
