1. So after they had all breakfasted Jesus addressed Peter, and referring to the food that they had just eaten, Jesus asked Simon Peter if he loved him, more than food. This was a fair question, for here they were fishing for food, rather than feeding the spiritually hungry ones among mankind, who needed their help. If Peter did love Jesus more than food, then he should be feeding his lambs, the little ones that put their faith in him.
