Most truly I say to you; When you were younger, you used to gird yourself and walk about where you wanted. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and another man will gird you, and bear you where you do not wish.

1. So Jesus told Peter, that when he was a young man he used to clothe himself and to walk about wherever he wanted to go. Yet Jesus prophesied, that when he grew older he would stretch out his hands, and another man would gird him, and then bear him where he did not want to go.

[Question] What did Jesus then tell Peter, about what changes would come upon his life in time?

2. And he came to us and took up the girdle of Paul, bound his own feet and hands and said; Thus says the Holy Spirit; The man to whom this girdle belongs, the Jews will bind in this manner in Jerusalem, and deliver into the hands of people of the nations. (Acts of Apostles 21:11)

[Question] What was prophesied to happen to Paul through the Holy Spirit, before he went up to Jerusalem?

3. As he saw it was pleasing to the Jews, he went on to arrest Peter also. As it was, those were days of the unfermented cakes. (Acts of Apostles 12:3)

[Question] What later happened to Peter during the festival of the Jews and how was he miraculously released?

4. For if a man should live even many years, in all of them let him rejoice. And let him remember the days of darkness, though they could be many, every day that has come in, is vanity. (Ecclesiastes 11:8)

[Question] What does the Bible counsel us to rejoice in?

5. And you, O son of man, look! They will certainly put cords upon you and bind you with them, so that you cannot go forth into the midst of them. (Ezekiel 3:25)

[Question] How did the Son of Man, Ezekiel receive similar counsel?

6. Knowing as I do, that the putting off of my tabernacle is soon to be, just as also our Lord Jesus Christ signified to

me. (2 Peter 1:14)

[Question] What did Peter later write to spirit anointed Christians, about his own time he had left on earth?
