

John 21:23~ In consequence, this saying went out among the brothers, that, that disciple would not die. However, Jesus did not say to him, that he would not die, but; **If it is my will for him to remain until I come, of what concern is that to you?**

1· So in response to this statement of Jesus, many believed, that John would not die. He did in fact outlive the others by many years, but he did eventually die near to the age of 100. Yet Jesus had not said that he would not die, only that Peter should not concern himself with another's service to God, only with his own service to God.

[Question] What word then went out about John, because of what Jesus said here, that became misinterpreted?

[Question] How long did John actually live, and was this far longer than the other apostles?

[Question] What though, had Jesus actually told Peter to concern himself with?

2· A revelation by **Jesus** Christ, which God gave him, to show his slaves the things that must shortly take place. And he sent forth his angel, and presented it in signs through him, to his slave John. (**Revelation 1:1**)

[Question] Who gave the Revelation vision to Jesus, and for what purpose, and who was it presented through, and to?

3· I John, your brother and a sharer with you in the tribulation and kingdom and endurance in company with **Jesus**, came to be in the isle that is called Patmos, for speaking about God, and bearing witness to **Jesus**. (**Revelation 1:9**)

[Question] Where did John later find himself, as an old man, for speaking about the truth to others?
