As it was, there were six stone water jars sitting there as required by the purification rules of the Jews, each able to hold two or three liquid measures.¹

1. Now as it was, there were there, six stone water jars, for this is required by the purification rules of the Jews, and each of these jars was able to hold two or three liquid measures.
