John 3:20~ For he that practices vile things, hates the light, and does not come to the light, in order, that his works may not be reproved.

1. Jesus then showed Nicodemus, that those who do vile things hate the light, and they stay out of the light, so that their works might not be exposed, by the light of truth and of righteousness. Since truth exposes falsehood, like light reveals color, therefore such men do this so as to avoid being reproved for their wickedness.

[Question] What did Jesus show Nicodemus, that men who hate the light, hide from?

[Question] How can we illustrate, how truth exposes falsehoods?

[Question] Why then, do men hide their wicked deeds in the darkness?

What! Do you not know, that unrighteous persons will not inherit God's kingdom? Do not be misled! Neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men kept for unnatural purposes, nor men who lie with men. (1 Corinthians 6:9)

[Question] What kind of persons will not inherit God's Kingdom?

3. Now the works of the flesh are manifest, and they are fornication, uncleanness, loose conduct, idolatry, practice of spiritism, enmities, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, contentions, divisions, sects, envies, drunken bouts, revelries, and things like these. As to these things I am forewarning you, the same way as I did forewarn you, that those who practice such things will not inherit God's kingdom. (Galatians 5:19-21)

[Question] What are the works of the flesh?

4. For the time that has passed by is sufficient for you to have worked out the will of the nations, when you proceeded in deeds of loose conduct, lusts, excesses with wine, revelries, drinking matches, and illegal idolatries. (1 Peter 4:3)

[Question] How should the time before becoming a Christian, have been sufficient for learning the ways of the world, and what are those ways?

5. Now all the things that are being reproved, are made

manifest by the light, for everything that is being made manifest, is light. (Ephesians 5:13)

[Question] How are the things reproved made manifest, for what does light do to all things it touches?

6. Finally she took the deep pan and poured it out before him, but Amnon refused to eat and said; Have everybody go out from me! Then everybody went out from him. (2 Samuel 13:9)

[Question] How did Amnon disguise and hide his wicked ways before his family?

7. And I myself entered the house of Shemaiah the son of Delaiah the son of Mehetabel while he was shut up. And he proceeded to say; Let us meet by appointment at the house of the true God, within the temple, and let us close the doors of the temple, for they are coming in to kill you, even by night they are coming in to kill you. (Nehemiah 6:10)

[Question] What scheme was hatched to kill Nehemiah?

8. In the darkness he has dug into houses, by day they must keep themselves locked in. They have not known daylight. (Job 24:16)

[Question] How do the workers of darkness progress?

9. How long will you inexperienced ones keep loving inexperience, and how long must you ridiculers desire for yourselves outright ridicule, and how long will you stupid ones keep hating knowledge? (Proverbs 1:22)

[Question] What do inexperienced ones love, and ridiculers, and stupid ones?

10. And you will have to say; How I have hated discipline, and my heart has disrespected even reproof! (Proverbs 5:12)

[Question] How do the Proverbs state, that a man will come to feel, when his bad works catch up with him?

11. The ridiculer does not love the one reproving him. To the wise ones he will not go. (Proverbs 15:12)

[Question] How does the ridiculer feel, about the one reproving him over his conduct, and who will he not seek out on his own?

12. Make the heart of this people unreceptive, and make their very ears unresponsive, and paste their very eyes together, that they may not see with their eyes, and with their ears they may not hear, and that their own heart may not understand, and that they may not actually turn back, and get healing for themselves. (Isaiah 6:10)

[Question] How did Yehowah God show through Isaiah, that he would make his unresponsive people act, for what did their hearts want?

13. Woe to those who are going very deep in concealing counsel from Yehowah himself, and whose deeds have occurred in a dark place, while they say; Who is seeing us, and who is knowing of us? (Isaiah 29:15)

[Question] What do men do to conceal what they are doing, and what do they choose to think about Yehowah God, and what he sees?
