

John 3:25~ Therefore a dispute arose on the part of the disciples of John with a Jew concerning purification.

1· Therefore a dispute arose with the disciples of John the Baptist, with a Jew, over the purification rites of the Jews.

[Question] What dispute then arose and between whom?

2· For the Pharisees and all the Jews, do not eat unless they wash their hands up to the elbow, holding fast the tradition of the men of former times. (**Mark 7:3**)

[Question] What was a common tradition then, among all the Jews?

3· As it was, there were six stone water jars sitting there, as required by the purification rules of the Jews, each able to hold two or three liquid measures. (**John 2:6**)

[Question] Why were there six water jars available at a marriage feast that Jesus and his disciples attended?
