

**John 3:32~** What he has seen and heard, of this he bears witness, but no man is accepting his witness.

- 1· John the Baptist then showed, that what Jesus had seen and heard from God, he bore witness to, or made manifest to men on earth, but no man was accepting his witness.

**[Question]** What did John the Baptist then show, that Jesus bore witness to, yet did men accept that witness?

- 2· I have many things to speak concerning you, and to pass judgment upon. As a matter of fact, he that sent me is true, and the very things I **heard** from him, I am speaking in the world. (**John 8:26**)

**[Question]** How did Jesus himself bear witness to, about what things he spoke, and where they came forth from?

- 3· I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master does. But I have called you friends, because all the things I have **heard** from my Father, I have made known to you. (**John 15:15**)

**[Question]** Why did Jesus not call his disciples slaves, for what things had he made known to them?

- 4· And he will come up like a twig before one, and like a root out of waterless land. No stately form does he have, nor any splendor, and when we shall see him, there is not the appearance so that we should desire him. (**Isaiah 53:2**)

**[Question]** How did the prophecy of Isaiah show, how Jesus would come up within Israel, and would he be appreciated and valued by God's people?

- 5· He came to his own home, but his own people did not take him in. (**John 1:11**)

**[Question]** How did the people of Jesus own territory treat him, when he came forth to Israel?

- 6· Most truly I say to you, what we know we speak, and what we have **seen** we bear **witness** of, but you people do not receive the **witness** we give. (**John 3:11**)

**[Question]** What things did Jesus show, that he continually bore witness to, yet how was this witness received?
