John 4:14~ Whoever drinks from the water, that I will give him, will never get thirsty at all, but the water that I will give him, will become in him, a fountain of water, bubbling up to impart everlasting life.

1. Then he contrasted this, with the water that he would give her. The water that he would give her after she would drink it, she would never get thirsty again, forever. Rather Jesus showed, that the water he would give her, would become like a fountain bubbling up within her, to impart everlasting life to her and to others.

[Question] How did Jesus now show, how the water he had to give was different from literal water?

[Question] Since Jesus was talking about spiritual truth, what would anyone partaking of this spiritual truth, keep doing forever afterwards, and what would this be like?

2. Clearly Jesus was speaking about the truth from God, which we take in only once, and then it becomes like a fountain within us, as we tell many others about it through our witnessing.

[Question] What then, was Jesus truly speaking about to this woman, and what does this truth become like within us, and how?

3. Jesus said to them; I am the bread of life. He that comes to me will not get hungry at all, and he that exercises faith in me, will never get thirsty at all. (John 6:35)

[Question] How did Jesus also show that he was like bread, and what would anyone eating of that bread never need again?

[Question] What hunger then was he speaking about?

4. He that puts faith in me, just as the Scripture has said: Out from his inmost part, streams of living water will flow. (John 7:38)

[Question] What did Jesus state about anyone putting faith in him, and what would flow outward from that one?

[Question] Can one become a true disciple of Jesus then, and not be a witness about his Kingdom?

5. And Yehowah will be bound to lead you constantly, and to satisfy your soul even in a scorched land, and he will invigorate your very bones, and you must become like a

well-watered garden, and like the source of water, the waters of which, do not lie. (Isaiah 58:11)

[Question] What did Yehowah God promise toward his people through the prophet Isaiah?

6 For the wages sin pays is death, but the gift God gives is everlasting life by Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 6:23)

[Question] What are the wages of sin, and what is the gift of God?

7. But we know, that the Son of God has come, and he has given us intellectual capacity, that we may gain the knowledge of the true one. And we are in union with the true one, by means of his Son, Jesus Christ. This is the true God, and life everlasting. (1 John 5:20)

[Question] What capacity has Jesus given Christians, so as to gain what knowledge?

8. The meek ones will eat and be satisfied, those seeking him will praise Yehowah. May your hearts live forever. (Psalms 22:26)

[Question] How will the meek ones of the earth fare before Yehowah God?

9. May my lips bubble forth praise, for you teach me your regulations. (Psalms 119:171)

[Question] How did the Psalmist want to express the goodness of his God Yehowah?

10" To its owners, insight is a well of life, and the discipline of the foolish ones, is foolishness. (Proverbs 16:22)

[Question] What is insight like, to those owning it?

11. And the heat-parched ground will have become as a reedy pool, and the thirsty ground as springs of water. In the abiding place of jackals, a resting-place for them, there will be green grass with reeds and papyrus plants. (Isaiah 35:7)

[Question] How did Isaiah prophetically describe the change in spiritual conditions that would come to his people, through literal examples?

12. They will not go hungry, neither will they go thirsty, nor will parching heat or sun strike them. For the One who is having pity upon them will lead them, and by the springs of water he will conduct them. (Isaiah 49:10)

[Question] What did Yehowah God promise to give to his people through his Messiah, and how would he lead them?

13. And gradually he brought me back to the entrance of the House, and, look! There was water going forth from under the threshold of the House eastward, for the front of the House was east. And the water was going down from under, from the right-hand side of the House, south of the altar. (Ezekiel 47:1)

[Question] What stream of living waters did Ezekiel see in vision, and where did it stream forth from?

[Question] Who was the first one to see this stream of water flowing forth from the throne of Yehowah God?

14. And it must occur that every living soul that swarms, in every place to which the double-size torrent comes, will get life. And it must occur, that there will be very many fish, because there, is where this water will certainly come, and the seawater will be healed, and everything will be alive, where the torrent comes. (Ezekiel 47:9)

[Question] What did Ezekiel show would become of everything, that this double-sized torrent touched?

15. Work, not for the food that perishes, but for the food that remains for life everlasting, which the Son of man will give you, for upon this one, the Father, even God, has put his seal of approval. (John 6:27)

[Question] What kind of food did Jesus tell his disciples to work hard for?

[Question] What kind of food will give one everlasting life?

16. Now on the last day, the great day of the festival, Jesus was standing up and he cried out, saying; If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink. (John 7:37)

[Question] What did Jesus tell spiritually thirsting ones, when at a festival in Jerusalem?

17. According as you have given him authority over all flesh, that, as regards the whole number whom you have given him, he may give them everlasting life. (John 17:2)

[Question] What awaits all those, who put faith in this living one, the Christ?

18. For truly by one spirit, we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free, and we were all made to drink one spirit. (1 Corinthians 12:13)

[Question] How are all anointed Christians baptized into one body, and do prior distinctions mean anything thereafter, for what do all drink?

19. And he showed me a river of water of life, clear as crystal, flowing out from the throne of God and of the Lamb. (Revelation 22:1)

[Question] What vision of Revelation shows a stream of living waters also, and where does it come from?

20" And the spirit and the bride keep on saying; Come! And let anyone hearing say; Come! And let anyone thirsting come, let anyone that wishes, take life's water free. (Revelation 22:17)

[Question] What open invitation does Yehowah God make to mankind, through Christ and his bride class?
