John 4:25~ The woman said to him; I know that Messiah is coming, who is called Christ. Whenever that one arrives, he will declare all things to us openly.

1. So the Samaritan woman said to Jesus, that she knew, that the Messiah was coming, who is also called Christ. Then she knew, that when that one arrived, that he would openly declare all things openly.

[Question] What did this Samaritan woman say, that she knew was coming in time?

[Question] What did she have faith, that this one would declare to the people?

2. A prophet I shall raise up for them from the midst of their brothers, like you, and I shall indeed put my words in his mouth, and he will certainly speak to them all that I shall command him. (Deuteronomy 18:18)

[Question] What promise does Moses make in the Bible record, and did the Samaritans have these writings to study and understand?

3. And you should know and have the insight, that from the going forth of the word to restore and to rebuild Jerusalem, until Messiah the Leader, there will be seven weeks, also sixty-two weeks. She will return and be actually rebuilt, with a public square and moat, but in the straits of the times. (Daniel 9:25)

[Question] What did the prophet Daniel show would come forth at the end of the sixty-nine weeks of years?

4. First this one found his own brother, Simon, and said to him; We have found the Messiah, which means, when translated, Christ. (John 1:41)

[Question] What did Andrew do, when hearing the witness of John the Baptist, that Jesus was the coming Messiah?

5. She said to him; Yes, Lord, I have believed that you are the Christ the Son of God, the One coming into the world. (John 11:27)

[Question] How did Martha feel about Jesus Christ, and what did she believe he was?

- 6. In answer Simon Peter said; You are the Christ, the Son of the living God. (Matthew 16:16)
 - [Question] Who did Peter identify Jesus Christ as being?
- 7. And all drank the same spiritual drink. For they used to drink from the spiritual rock-mass that followed them, and that rock-mass meant the Christ. (1 Corinthians 10:4)

[Question] Who was the spiritual rockmass that the Israelites in the wilderness drank from, and how was this pictured for them in a literal way through Moses?
