John 5:18~ On this account, indeed, the Jews began seeking all the more to kill him, because not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was also calling God his own Father, making himself equal to God.

1. So for this fine deed the Jews began seeking all the more to kill him, for not only was he breaking the Sabbath, in their eyes, but he was calling God his father, and they saw this as a making of himself equal to God, though he was not making himself equal to God, for he himself said; The father is greater than I am.

[Question] Why then, did the Jews seek to kill Jesus, for what did they feel he was making of himself?

[Question] What did Jesus himself state, to counter this idea, that he ever tried to make himself equal to God?

2. Now after these things Jesus continued walking about in Galilee, for he did not want to walk about in Judea, because the Jews were seeking to kill him. (John 7:1)

[Question] Why did Jesus then return to Galilee, and stay away from Judea?

3. Moses gave you the Law, did he not? But not one of you obeys the Law. Why are you seeking to kill me? (John 7:19)

[Question] What did these men say they trusted in, and yet did any one of them, obey the Law Covenant fully?

[Question] What was their seeking to kill Jesus, a proof of?

4. But if I am doing them, even though you do not believe me, believe the works, in order, that you may come to know, and may continue knowing, that the Father is in union with me, and I am in union with the Father. (John 10:38)

[Question] What did Jesus tell men to believe, even if they choose not to believe his words?

[Question] What did his works show to all men, that he had?

5' You heard that I said to you, I am going away and I am coming back to you. If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going my way to the Father, because the Father is greater than I am. (John 14:28)

[Question] What did Jesus tell his disciples that Yehowah God was greater than, and why was this a cause for joy?

6' Who, although he was existing in God's form, gave no consideration to a seizure, namely, that he should be equal to God. (Philippians 2:6)

[Question] What form did Jesus exist in from the beginning, but what did he never give consideration to?

7. But the Pharisees went out and took counsel against him, that they might destroy him. (Matthew 12:14)

[Question] What did the Pharisees take counsel to do to Jesus, over his fine works and teachings, of which they were jealous?

8. He has put his trust in God. Let Him now rescue him, if He wants him, for he said; I am God's Son. (Matthew 27:43)

[Question] What did they mockingly state, while Jesus was being killed?

9. Therefore some of the inhabitants of Jerusalem began to say; This is the man they are seeking to kill, is it not? (John 7:25)

[Question] How though, did the common people view Jesus, and his seeming freedom among them?

10" The Jews answered him; We are stoning you, not for a fine work, but for blasphemy, even because you, although being a man, make yourself a god. (John 10:33)

[Question] What did the Jews say, that they wanted to stone Jesus over, for what did they think he was making of himself, because he said he was God's Son?

11. Therefore from that day on they took counsel to kill him. (John 11:53)

[Question] What did they therefore do from that day onward?

12. The Jews answered him; We have a Law, and according to the Law he ought to die, because he made himself God's son. (John 19:7)

[Question] Why did the Jews feel, that Jesus was deserving of death, for what had he said he was?
