John 6:38~ Because I have come down from heaven, to do, not my will, but the will of him that sent me.

1. Jesus then told them that he had come down from heaven to do, not his own will, but the will of his heavenly Father.

**[Question]** Whose will did Jesus come down from heaven to perform among men?

2. Moreover, no man has ascended into heaven, but he that descended from heaven, the Son of man. (John 3:13)

[Question] What man alone, has ever ascended into heaven?

3. So he went on to say to them; You are from the realms below. I am from the realms above. You are from this world. I am not from this world. (John 8:23)

[Question] Where did the life of the man Jesus Christ emanate from in the beginning?

4. Jesus said to them; If God were your Father, you would love me, for from God I came forth, and am here. Neither have I come of my own initiative at all, but that One sent me forth. (John 8:42)

[Question] What did Jesus state to men, who claimed to love Yehowah God, for whose will, did Jesus always accomplish?

5. And going a little way forward, he fell upon his face, praying and saying; My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass away from me. Yet, not as I will, but as you will. (Matthew 26:39)

[Question] Whose will, did Jesus do, even when facing a painful death?

6. I cannot do a single thing of my own initiative. Just as I hear, I judge. The judgment that I render is righteous, because I seek, not my own will, but the will of him that sent me. (John 5:30)

[Question] What did Jesus state, that he could not do?

[Question] Why were his judgments then, righteous judgments?

7. Look! My servant, on whom I keep fast hold! My chosen

one, whom my soul has approved! I have put my spirit in him. Justice to the nations is what he will bring forth. (Isaiah 42:1)

[Question] What did Isaiah write about this Messianic servant, and what he would bring forth to the nations?

8. And he went on to say; Abba, Father, all things are possible to you, remove this cup from me. Yet not what I want, but what you want. (Mark 14:36)

[Question] Whose will was foremost in Jesus' mind to accomplish?

9. Saying; Father, if you wish, remove this cup from me. Nevertheless, let, not my will, but yours take place. (Luke 22:42)

[Question] Whose will did Jesus give his own lifeblood to fulfill?

10" Jesus said to them; My food is for me to do the will of him that sent me, and to finish his work. (John 4:34)

[Question] What did Jesus consider the doing of Yehowah God will to be like for him?

[Question] Whose will then, must men do, to partake of the true bread from heaven?

11: What, therefore, if you should behold the Son of man ascending to where he was before? (John 6:62)

[Question] What did Jesus ask of his disciples, when they had trouble understanding certain matters?

12. Then he actually says; Look! I am come to do your will. He does away with what is first, that he may establish what is second. (Hebrews 10:9)

[Question] What did Jesus do away with, through his doing of God's will?
