But there are some of you that do not believe. For from the beginning, Jesus knew who were the ones not believing, and who was the one that would betray him.

1' Yet Jesus knew, that there were some there that did not believe him, when he spoke these things. For from the very beginning of Judas' betrayal, Jesus knew his thoughts, and also the thoughts of all the others.

[Question] What did Jesus then tell his disciples, that some of them failed to believe, for what did he always know about their thoughts?

2. And Jesus, knowing their thoughts, said; Why are you thinking wicked things in your hearts? (Matthew 9:4)

[Question] What did Jesus know about men before they spoke, as was evidenced by many of his statements?

3. But Jesus himself was not entrusting himself to them, because of his knowing them all (John 2:24)

[Question] Why did Jesus not entrust himself to men, for what could he read within them?

4. He knew, indeed, the man betraying him. This is why he said; Not all of you are clean. (John 13:11)

[Question] What did Jesus foreknow, though it was never spoken of?

5. And because he was in no need to have anyone bear witness about man, for he himself knew what was in man. (John 2:25)

[Question] What was Jesus in no need of hearing about man, and why?

6. But I have said to you, you have even seen me, and yet do not believe. (John 6:36)

[Question] What showed Jesus that men did not believe?

7 Because I, on the other hand, tell the truth, you do not believe me. (John 8:45)

[Question] Why did men choose not to believe Jesus?

8. But you do not believe, because you are none of my sheep.
