Hence they began seeking to get hold of him, but no one laid a hand upon him, because his hour had not yet come.

- 1· So because he said these things, they began seeking how to get hold of him, but no one actually laid a hand upon him, for it was not yet the hour for him to be given into their hands, for he yet had much more work to do.

**[Question]** How though, did the religious leaders view his statements here?

**[Question]** What though, could they not do then, and why?

- 2· And the chief priests and the scribes heard it, and they began to seek how to destroy him, for they were in fear of him, for all the crowd was continually being astounded at his teaching. (**Mark 11:18**)

**[Question]** What did the chief priests and scribes seek to do, upon hearing these statements, and why?

**[Question]** Who were the common people going after, and how did this make the religious leaders feel?

- 3· Furthermore, he went teaching daily in the temple. But the chief priests and the scribes and the principal ones of the people were **seeking** to destroy him. (**Luke 19:47**)

**[Question]** Where did Jesus teach daily when in Jerusalem?

**[Question]** What though, was the plan of the religious leaders then toward Jesus?

- 4· While I was with you in the temple day after day you did not stretch out your **hands** against me. But this is your **hour**, and the authority of darkness. (**Luke 22:53**)

**[Question]** What did Jesus state to these ones on the night of his arrest, for what hour was that?

- 5· These sayings he spoke in the treasury, as he was teaching in the temple. But no one **laid hold** of him, because his **hour** had not yet **come**. (**John 8:20**)

**[Question]** Where was Jesus when he made these statements, and yet why did they not seize him then?

- 6· Therefore Jesus said to them; My due time is not yet

**present, but your due time is always at hand. (John 7:6)**

**[Question]** What time was it not then for Jesus, yet why was his disciple's due time always at hand?

**7· Therefore they tried again to seize him, but he got out of their reach. (John 10:39)**

**[Question]** What did Jesus do on one occasion, when they tried to seize him?

**8· Jesus answered him; You would have no authority at all against me unless it had been granted to you from above. This is why the man that handed me over to you, has greater sin. (John 19:11)**
