For nobody does anything in secret, while himself seeking to be known publicly. If you do these things, manifest yourself to the world.

1' His fleshly brothers then counseled him, that no one does things in secret while himself trying to be known. They reasoned, that since he was doing fine works, why hide them, and that they should be brought out into the open. However Jesus was much more cautious than they, for he understood many things that others thought.

[Question] How did Jesus' brothers reason with him then?
[Question] Why though, was Jesus much more cautious than his fleshly brothers?

2. Judas, not Iscariot, said to him; Lord, what has happened that you intend to show yourself plainly to us and not to the world? (John 14:22)

[Question] How did the faithful apostle Judas later question Jesus, for what did he not understand then?
