And yet if I do judge, my judgment is truthful, because I am not alone, but the Father¹ who sent me, is with me.

1. So Jesus told them, that even if he did judge, that nonetheless, his judgment would be in harmony with truth, because he was never alone, but the Father, who originally sent him forth as his spokesperson, was always with him.

[Question] What did Jesus state, that any judgment of his, would always be, and why?

2. Do you not believe that I am in union with the Father and the Father is in union with me? The things I say to you men, I do not speak of my own originality, but the Father who remains in union with me, is doing his works. (John 14:10)

[Question] What did Jesus state, that he was always in union with, and so whose words did he always speak?

3. Look! The hour is coming, indeed, it has come, when you will be scattered each one to his own house, and you will leave me alone, and yet I am not alone, because the Father is with me. (John 16:32)

[Question] What hour did Jesus tell his disciples was fast approaching, yet would Jesus ever be alone?

4. And you must put the Urim and the Thummim into the breastpiece of judgment, and they must prove to be over Aaron's heart when he comes in before Yehowah, and Aaron must carry the judgments of the sons of Israel over his heart before Yehowah constantly. (Exodus 28:30)

[Question] What was Aaron to keep close to his heart when handling matters of judgment?

5. And he went on to say to the judges; See what you are doing, because it is not for man that you judge, but it is for Yehowah, and he is with you in the matter of judgment. (2 Chronicles 19:6)

[Question] Whose behalf did Jehoshaphat tell the judges, that they were judging for?

6. And there will be enjoyment by him in the fear of Yehowah. And he will not judge by any mere appearance to his eyes, nor reprove simply according to the thing heard by his ears. (Isaiah 11:3)

[Question] What did Isaiah show, that the Messiah would not judge by?

7. And as for you, O son of man, will you judge, will you judge the bloodguilty city, and certainly cause her to know all her detestable things? (Ezekiel 22:2)

[Question] What was the Son Of Man told to do, respecting the bloodguilty city of Jerusalem?
