John 8:54~ Jesus answered; If I glorify myself, my glory is nothing. It is my Father that glorifies me, he, who you say, is your God.

1. So Jesus answered, that if he were to glorify himself by telling them who he was, then his glory would be nothing, for it would be self-proclaimed. So he told them, that he left it for his Father to glorify him, not seeking to glorify himself at all. They claimed to worship this same God, but here they were dishonoring him over nothing.

[Question] Why did Jesus then refrain from tooting his own horn, even though he was greater than Abraham or David?

[Question] Who then, did Jesus leave it to, to glorify him?

[Question] What did these men claim to worship, yet how were they treating his representative?

2. I do not accept glory from men. (John 5:41)

[Question] What did Jesus never accept from men?

3. And God will himself glorify him, and he will glorify him immediately. (John 13:32)

[Question] What did Jesus state to his close disciples, on the last day of his life?

4 The God of Abraham and of Isaac and of Jacob, the God of our forefathers, has glorified his Servant, Jesus, whom you, for your part, delivered up and disowned before Pilate's face, when he had decided to release him. (Acts of Apostles 3:13)

[Question] How did Yehowah God glorify Jesus Christ days later, yet how had the Jewish religious leaders treated Jesus when before Pilate?

 5. Therefore Jesus cried out as he was teaching in the temple and said; You both know me, and know where I am from.
Also, I have not come of my own initiative, but he that sent me is real, and you do not know him. (John 7:28)

[Question]What did Jesus cry out, as he was teaching in the temple?[Question]Did Jesus come to earth of his own initiative?

6. So too, the Christ did not glorify himself by becoming a High Priest, but was glorified by him, who spoke with reference to him: You are my son. I, today, I have become your father. (Hebrews 5:5)

[Question] Who glorified Jesus when he spoke what words from heaven about him?
