And Jesus said; For this judgment, I came into this world, that those not seeing, might see, and those seeing, might become blind.

1. So Jesus said to the man, that the reason he had come into the world was so that those not seeing might see, referring to ones like the man before him, and so that those seeing, referring to the Pharisees who said, that they could see and understand all the matters of the Law Covenant, but who remained blind to the truth, might become blind.

[Question] What then, did Jesus tell this man born blind, who was now healed?

[Question] How did this show itself through the man himself, and the Pharisees who rejected Jesus, the light of the world?

2. But if anyone hears my sayings and does not keep them, I do not judge him, for I came, not to judge the world, but to save the world. (John 12:47)

[Question] Did Jesus come to judge those who heard his words, and did not want to do them, for why had he come forth?

3. Yehowah's spirit is upon me, because he anointed me to declare Good News to the poor, he sent me forth to preach a release to the captives, and a recovery of sight to the blind, to send the crushed ones away with a release. (Luke 4:18)

[Question] Why did Yehowah God anoint his son, Jesus Christ, and send him forth to preach?

4. I have come as a light into the world, in order, that everyone putting faith in me, may not remain in the darkness. (John 12:46)

[Question] Why had Jesus come forth as a light, into the world?

5. Therefore here I am, the One that will act wonderfully again with this people, in a wonderful manner, and with something wonderful, and the wisdom of their wise men must perish, and the very understanding of their discreet men, will conceal itself. (Isaiah 29:14)

[Question] How did Yehowah God promise, that he would act towards his people, and what would happen then to the wisdom of their own wise men, and their discreet ones?

6. At that time Jesus said in response; I publicly praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and intellectual ones, and have revealed them to babes. (Matthew 11:25)

[Question] Why did Jesus himself publicly praise Yehowah God?

7. This is why I speak to them by the use of illustrations, because, looking, they look in vain, and hearing, they hear in vain, neither do they get the sense of it. (Matthew 13:13)

[Question] Why did Jesus always teach and speak through illustrations, for what did Yehowah God not want those with bad hearts to do?

8. Now this is the basis for judgment, that the light has come into the world, but men have loved the darkness, rather than the light, for their works were wicked. (John 3:19)

**[Question]** What did Jesus state, was to become the basis for judgment?

[Question] Why then, did men choose not to listen to Jesus teachings, and to do them?

9. Saying; Go to this people and say; By hearing, you will hear, but by no means understand, and looking you will look, but by no means see. (Acts of Apostles 28:26)

[Question] What had Isaiah prophesied about the Jews, and how was this fulfilled in the time after Jesus' death?

10" And just as they did not approve of holding God in accurate knowledge, God gave them up to a disapproved mental state, to do the things not fitting. (Romans 1:28)

[Question] What does Yehowah God do those people who refuse to hold him in accurate knowledge, and what does he give them up to?

11' For if these things are not present in anyone, he is blind, shutting his eyes to the light, and has become forgetful of his cleansing, from his sins of long ago. (2 Peter 1:9)

[Question] What things did Peter show must be within a Christian, or else he is blind to the truth, and has forgotten his cleansing of long ago?

12. When they began to come down to him, Elisha went on to pray to Yehowah and say; Please, strike this nation with blindness. So he struck them with blindness according to the word of Elisha. (2 Kings 6:18)

[Question] What did the prophet Elisha pray of Yehowah God to do to Israel?

13. And you kept trusting in your badness. You have said;
There is no one seeing me. Your wisdom and your
knowledge, this is what has led you away. You keep saying
in your heart; I am, and there is nobody else. (Isaiah
47:10)

[Question] What did Isaiah show, that the men of Israel trusted in, and why they were being led away from a path of righteousness?
