After he said these things, he spit on the ground and made a clay with the saliva, and put his clay upon the man's eyes.

1. So after saying these things, he spit on the ground, and made a clay from the dirt and saliva, and then put this clay upon the man's eyelids. Therefore Jesus was the light of the world, that made men's eyes see, through his light.

[Question] What then, did Jesus do to heal the blind man?[Question] How were Jesus' words here very appropriate to

accompany the healing of a blind man?

2. And he took the blind man by the hand, brought him outside the village, and, having spit upon his eyes, he laid his hands upon him, and began to ask him; Do you see anything? (Mark 8:23)

[Question] Where did Jesus then lead the man, and what did he do to the man to heal his blindness?

3. And he took him away from the crowd privately and put his fingers into the man's ears, and, after spitting, he touched his tongue. (Mark 7:33)

[Question] What did Jesus also do to a man, who was both deaf and dumb?

4. Incidentally, it was Sabbath on the day that Jesus made the clay and opened his eyes. (John 9:14)

[Question] What day was it, when Jesus did this healing of the man born blind?

5. But some of them said; Was not this man that opened the eyes of the blind man, able to prevent this one from dying? (John 11:37)

[Question] What did some say, when later Jesus' friend Lazarus died?
