Ephesians 1:23~ Which is his body, the fullness of him who fills up all things in all.

1. The congregation of these anointed ones is Christ's body and he is the head of this body. This gives him a fullness greater than the fullness he possessed, before coming to the earth.

[Question] What is Jesus Christ the head of, and what are all anointed ones like, within it?

[Question] What fullness does this give to him, after fulfilling his life course here on earth?

2. So we, although many, are one body in union with Christ, but members belonging individually to one another. (Romans 12:5)

[Question] Though many members, 1440,000 in total, what are they all together?

3. From him all the body, by being harmoniously joined together and being made to cooperate, through every joint that gives what is needed, according to the functioning of each respective member, in due measure, makes for the growth of the body, for the building up of itself, in love. (Ephesians 4:16)

[Question] In any body, how must the various members work together, and to what end purpose?

4. For I do not want you, brothers, to be ignorant of this sacred secret, in order for you not to be discreet in your own eyes; That a dulling of sensibilities has happened in part to Israel, until the full number of people of the nations has come in. (Romans 11:25)

[Question] Whose spiritual sensibilities have been dulled, until the full number of the Gentile Christians is sealed?

5' Where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcision nor uncircumcision, foreigner, Scythian, slave, freeman, but Christ is all things, and in all. (Colossians 3:11)

[Question] What prior distinctions disappear through Christianity?

6 Now you are Christ's body, and members individually. (1

Corinthians 12:27)

[Question] What was anointed Christians both individually and collectively?

7. Because we are members of his body. (Ephesians 5:30)

[Question] What are all anointed ones in respect to Christ?

8. I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for you, and I, in my turn, am filling up what is lacking of the tribulations of the Christ in my flesh, on behalf of his body, which is the congregation. (Colossians 1:24)

[Question] What was Paul filling up by his self-sacrificing way?

9. Because it is in him that all the fullness of the divine quality dwells bodily. (Colossians 2:9)

[Question] Where does all the fullness of the divine quality of the spirit dwell?
