

Ephesians 2:4~ But God, who is rich in mercy, for his great love with which he loved us.

- 1· Yet despite this fruitless form of conduct and thinking, God, because he is rich in his undeserved kindness toward humans, expressed mercy and great love by sending his Son, Jesus Christ, to die for sinful mankind, and to release them from Satan the Devil's grip.

[Question] What did Yehowah God do for mankind despite their fruitless form of conduct?

[Question] What did he thus release them from?

- 2· Yehowah is good to all, and his mercies are over all his works. (**Psalms 145:9**)

[Question] What is always true about God, and what is over all his works?

- 3· For the mountains themselves may be removed, and the very hills may stagger, but my loving-kindness itself will not be removed from you, nor will my covenant of peace itself stagger, Yehowah, the One having **mercy** upon you, has said. (**Isaiah 54:10**)

[Question] What durable things may someday fail mankind, but what will certainly not fail them?

- 4· For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, for there is the same Lord over all, who is **rich** to all those calling upon him. (**Romans 10:12**)

[Question] What distinctions did the Christ put an end to?

- 5· But God recommends his own **love** to us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. (**Romans 5:8**)

[Question] How does Yehowah God recommend his own love to mankind?

- 6· By this, the **love** of God was made manifest in our case, because God sent forth his only-begotten Son into the world, that we might gain life through him. (**1 John 4:9**)

[Question] Why did Yehowah God willingly sacrifice his only-begotten son for us, and what does this act make manifest among the human family?

- 7· As for us, we **love**, because he first **loved** us. (**1 John 4:19**)

[Question] Why do we therefore love?

- 8· However, Yehowah showed them favor and had **mercy** upon them and turned to them for the sake of his covenant with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, and he did not want to bring them to ruin, and he did not cast them away from before his face until now. (**2 Kings 13:23**)

[Question] Why did Yehowah time and again return to his covenant people in mercy and compassion?

- 9· Yehowah is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and **great** in loving-kindness. (**Psalms 145:8**)

[Question] What are some of Yehowah God's finest qualities?

- 10· He will again show us **mercy**. He will subject our errors. And you will throw into the depths of the sea all their sins. (**Micah 7:19**)

[Question] By showing mercy, where did he figuratively throw their errors?

- 11· However, he did not let him, but said to him; Go home to your relatives, and report to them all the things Yehowah has done for you, and the **mercy** he had on you. (**Mark 5:19**)

[Question] What did Jesus tell the man whom he healed?

- 12· He who did not even spare his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, why will he not also with him, kindly give us all other things? (**Romans 8:32**)

[Question] If Yehowah God gave his own son to mankind, will there be anything, that he will hold back from mankind?

- 13· May the Lord grant him to find **mercy** from Yehowah in that day. And all the services he rendered in Ephesus you know well enough. (**2 Timothy 1:18**)

[Question] What did Paul ask God to grant to Onesiphorus and his household?
