Ephesians 4:19~ Having come to be past all moral sense, they gave themselves over to loose conduct<sup>1</sup> to work uncleanness<sup>2</sup> of every sort with greediness.

1. People of the world have come to be past all good moral sense, and their way of life has been given over to the performance, of nothing, but loose conduct in God's eyes. They work uncleanness of every sort with extreme greediness, which is nothing more than idolatry. They are the direct opposite of holy conduct!

[Question] What have people of the world been given over to, and why?

[Question] What do such ones want to do, with all the glorious gifts that God gives to them?

2. And just as they did not approve of holding God in accurate knowledge, God gave them up to a disapproved mental state, to do the things not fitting. (Romans 1:28)

[Question] What does Yehowah God give people over to, if they fail to accept the truth about him?

Perhaps, when I come again, my God might humiliate me among you, and I might mourn over many of those who formerly sinned, but have not repented over their uncleanness and fornication and loose conduct, that they have practiced. (2 Corinthians 12:21)

[Question] What did Paul not want to have to mourn over, if they had not repented?

4. Now the works of the flesh are manifest, and they are fornication, uncleanness, loose conduct, idolatry, practice of spiritism, enmities, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, contentions, divisions, sects, envies, drunken bouts, revelries, and things like these. (Galatians 5:19-21)

[Question] What are some of the works of the flesh, that will keep anyone from entering the Kingdom of God?

5. My reason is that certain men have slipped in who have long ago been appointed by the Scriptures to this judgment, ungodly men, turning the undeserved kindness of our God into an excuse for loose conduct, and proving false to our only Owner and Lord, Jesus Christ. (Jude 1:4)

[Question] Who had already in Jude's time slipped into the congregation, and for what purpose?

6. That is why, God gave them up to disgraceful sexual appetites, for both their females changed the natural use of themselves into one contrary to nature. (Romans 1:26)

[Question] What does God give such ones up to, for what have they done that is disgraceful?

7. They are even dogs strong in soulful desire, they have known no satisfaction. They are also shepherds that have not known how to understand. They have all of them turned to their own way, each one for his unjust gain from his own border. (Isaiah 56:11)

[Question] What does Isaiah the prophet compare them to, and whose way do they follow?

8. Before they could lie down, the men of the city, the men of Sodom, surrounded the house, from boy to old man, all the people in one mob. (Genesis 19:4)

[Question] What disgraceful sexual appetites, did the men of Sodom and Gomorrah, display towards God's angels?

9. And the men did not want to listen to him. Hence the man took hold of his concubine and brought her forth to them outside, and they began to have intercourse with her, and kept on abusing her all night long until the morning, after which they sent her off at the ascending of the dawn. (Judges 19:25)

[Question] What did the men of Benjamin display similarly?

10. For from inside, out of the heart of men, injurious reasonings issue forth; Fornications, thieveries, murders, adulteries, covetings, acts of wickedness, deceit, loose conduct, an envious eye, blasphemy, haughtiness, unreasonableness. (Mark 7:22)

[Question] What did Jesus Christ state, that issues forth from inside of a man?

- 11. As in the daytime let us walk decently, not in revelries and drunken bouts, not in illicit intercourse and loose conduct, not in strife and jealousy. (Romans 13:13)
  - [Question] Who should anointed Christians be walking, and what forms of illicit conduct, must they abstain from?
- 12. For the time that has passed by is sufficient for you to have worked out the will of the nations when you proceeded in deeds of loose conduct, lusts, excesses with wine, revelries, drinking matches, and illegal idolatries. (1 Peter 4:3)

[Question] What time, that passed by before their becoming anointed Christians, should have been sufficient for them to have become sick of the way of the world?
