Ephesians 5:10~ Keep on making sure of what is acceptable to the Lord.

1. Anointed Christians are encouraged by Paul to keep making sure of what things are acceptable to the Lord. They do this through a thorough study of the Bible, and through extensive prayer daily, to get the mind of the spirit, on matters of importance. By doing these fine things, they will always be correctly guided, in what is acceptable to the Lord.

[Question] How can anointed Christians keep making sure, of what is acceptable to God and Christ?

2. And quit being fashioned after this system of things, but be transformed by making your mind over, that you may prove to yourselves, the good, and acceptable, and perfect will of God. (Romans 12:2)

[Question] What should anointed Christians stop being patterned after?

[Question] What work must they do to make over their minds to God's way of thinking?

[Question] What power of mind is paramount in this changeover?

3. That you may make sure of the more important things, so that you may be flawless, and not be stumbling others up to the day of Christ. (Philippians 1:10)

[Question] What should we continually be sure about, and why?

4' Turn away, turn away, get out of there, touch nothing unclean. Get out from the midst of her, keep yourselves clean, you who are carrying the utensils of Yehowah. (Isaiah 52:11)

[Question] What counsel are those carrying the utensils of true worship given?

5. Now I exhort you, brothers, to keep your eye on those who cause divisions, and occasions for stumbling, contrary to the teaching, that you have learned, and avoid them.

(Romans 16:17)

[Question] What exhortation did Paul give, on who to avoid, and why so?

6. Now we are giving you orders, brothers, in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, to withdraw from every brother walking disorderly, and not according to the tradition you received from us. (2 Thessalonians 3:6)

[Question] Who were they given orders to withdraw from, and why?

7. Having a form of godly devotion but proving false to its power, and from these turn away. (2 Timothy 3:5)

[Question] What would some claiming to be God's servants come to have, yet how would it prove false, and how should we view such ones?
