Figure 1:5~ You slaves, be obedient to those who are your masters in a fleshly sense, with fear and trembling in the sincerity of your hearts, as to the Christ.

1. Now Paul counsels slaves, who are working under a master. They are told to be obedient to them in a fleshly sense. This would preclude accepting things, that are against being a Christian, like eating blood, or committing murder or committing fornication, for example.

[Question] What topic does Paul now turn to?

[Question] In what things must a slave be obedient, but what things would he not have to do, that would wound his Christian conscience?

2. Otherwise though, they are to serve their masters with fear and trembling, and in the sincerity of their hearts, doing all the things, that they are told to do.

[Question] In exclusion of those things though, how are they to serve their fleshly masters?

3. Let as many as are slaves under a yoke keep on considering their owners worthy of full honor, that the name of God and the teaching may never be spoken of injuriously. (1 Timothy 6:1)

[Question] What should Christians slaves consider, that their masters are worthy of, and why should they actually act this way?

4. Let house servants be in subjection to their owners with all due fear, not only to the good and reasonable, but also to those hard to please. (1 Peter 2:18)

[Question] How should house servants be in subjection to their owners, regardless of whether they are easy or hard to please?

5. Consequently, my beloved ones, in the way that you have always obeyed, not during my presence only, but now much more readily during my absence, keep working out your own salvation with fear and trembling. (Philippians 2:12)

[Question] What must each anointed Christian keep working out, and how so?

6. And Yehowah's angel went on to say to her; Return to your mistress and humble yourself under her hand. (Genesis 16:9)

[Question] What was rebellious Hagar told to do, by the angel, to be blessed?

7' Then something to eat was set before him, but he said; I shall not eat until I have spoken about my matters. Hence he said; Speak! (Genesis 24:33)

[Question] How did the slave of Abraham feel about carrying out the orders of his master, though not anywhere near to him?

8' You slaves, be obedient in everything to those who are your masters in a fleshly sense, not with acts of eyeservice, as men pleasers, but with sincerity of heart, with fear of Yehowah. (Colossians 3:22)

[Question] How should slaves be obedient to their masters, for who are they truly serving, in whatever they do in life?

9. Let slaves be in subjection to their owners in all things, and please them well, not talking back. (Titus 2:9)

[Question] How should slaves be in subjection to their owners, and what would they be careful not to speak toward them?

10. For the Lord's sake subject yourselves to every human creation, whether to a king as being superior (1 Peter 2:13)

[Question] Whom should anointed Christians subject themselves to?
